- 2) Monitor their completion of the weekly revision focus.



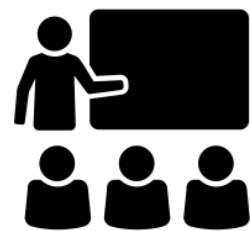
### What does every Southchurch History student already have?
