### Message from the Headteacher

Once again, we have had an extremely busy week at Southchurch High!

The Year 11 mock examinations finished this week with students sitting their French speaking exams. Students will receive their GCSE mock results next week ahead of the Year 11 Parents' Evening next Thursday, 14 March.

Thank you to Mrs Adams for kindly organising the reading tests on Monday for all students in Years 8 and 9. The reading tests are an important part of our continued drive to improve reading ages and literacy skills and we implement a termly reading assessment for each year group. These tests are rigorous and help us to determine which students require intervention in either literacy (phonics-based learning) or reading (comprehension and inference skills, for example). Without an age-appropriate level of reading, students will find it more challenging to access the curriculum in all subjects.

On Tuesday, a small number of Year 8 students visited the Greenwich Maritime Museum kindly organised by Miss Fraser for students to develop their knowledge of the British Empire and exploration of the globe. Students attended a workshop regarding the British Empire and the Atlantic Slave Trade and also visited the Cutty Sark enabling students to experience life on a trade ship. Thank you to Miss House and Miss Smith who also kindly accompanied the trip.

Thank you to Mr Webster for his support of the rugby sevens tournament at St Thomas More School on Tuesday and to all those Year 9 students who took part.

On Wednesday, Miss Waite kindly supported students from Years 7 to 11 at Southend Borough's swimming gala at Garon Park. All the students performed incredibly well and we were especially proud of Harry, Year 11, who won a gold in the 50 metres open butterfly and silver in the 50 metres freestyle. Thank you to Miss Waite and all the students who took part.

We were delighted to welcome a number of Trustees from Partnership Learning, the school's Academy Trust, on Wednesday. The Trustees' schedule included a Learning Walk of the school accompanied by students from the Student Leadership Team, as well as a meeting with selected students. Thank you to all those students and staff who kindly assisted with their visit.

Other activities during the week included a book quiz for Year 7s, 'The Masked Reader' competition and the 'Golden Ticket' event. It is so important that we, as a school, and yourselves as parents/carers, encourage our young people to read!

It was also National Careers Week this week and Ms Smith organised a number of activities throughout the week.

Write it down - this increases our chances of sticking to it


Tell someone - this makes us more committed

### **SEND News**

Over the next few weeks of SEND news we are going to be talking about executive function skills. Executive function is like the manager of the brain - it helps you plan, organise, and get things done. There are seven skills that are classed as executive function skills, and this week we will be focusing on task initiation. This is the part of executive functioning that helps you start tasks without procrastinating.

At times we all might find it challenging to get started on tasks or homework. Sometimes, it's tempting to put things off until the last minute. But improving task initiation skills can help us to manage our time better and reduce stress.

Here are some tips for our students:

- 1. Break tasks into smaller steps: If a task feels overwhelming, break it down into smaller, manageable steps. This can make it easier to get started.
- 2. Set specific goals: Instead of saying "I'll work on this later," set specific goals like "I will start my homework at 4 pm." This can help you focus and get started.
- 3. Create a routine: Establishing a daily routine can make it easier to start tasks consistently. Set aside specific times for homework, or other responsibilities.
- 4. The right environment: Create a quiet, organised space for studying and completing tasks. Try to minimise distractions and ask for help when needed. Remember, developing good task initiation skills takes practice and patience. However, we hope that these tips
