Message from the Headteacher

I would like to start by personally thanking you all for your ongoing, and continued, support of the school.

There have been many highlights this spring term and much to celebrate. I would like to start by saying how proud we are of our Year 11 students for working extremely hard during their mock examinations and in their preparation for their GCSE examinations which start the second week after our return from the Easter holidays! Revision sessions will be taking place during the second week of the holidays and the programme has been issued to students and is also available to view on the school's website. Could I please ask Year 11 parents/carers to encourage their children to attend as many of these sessions as they are able to. I would like to express my gratitude and thanks to all those staff who are kindly offering up a revision session during the second week of their Easter break.

I am sure students and staff have their own favourite highlights from this term but a couple of mine would have to be the visit by Adisa, the poet, whom I had the pleasure of working with a very long time ago and it was so lovely to catch up with him again and secondly, the go-kart event for our Year 7 students whose sheer excitement and enjoyment of the day will stay with me for a long time.

We were lucky enough to hold another STEM Day on Tuesday for our Year 9 students kindly organised and supported by Mr Grover. The Small Piece Trust kindly delivered the STEM Day activity based around sustainable living. Students took part in 'The Sustainable Homes Challenge'; working in small teams to design and build a system to filter, collect, detect, and pump collected rainwater as part of an integrated system on a sustainable home as generating energy and providing clean water supplies are huge 21st century engineering challenges. They designed and built a waterproof collection tank with a built-in filter, assembled, and soldered an electronic water-detector, and made a circuit for an electric pump to detect and then pump the water that had been collected. The students had such an amazing experience and it was wonderful to receive so many lovely follow up messages from parents/carers who wrote in saying 'what a great time their child had had'. Once again, a huge thank you to Mr Grover and all those who kindly supported on Wednesday with the activities.

Thank you to all those parents/carers who kindly attended our Parent Forum last night. We welcomed the opportunity to answer questions and to provide those attending with an update on actions taken to date and those planned for the future.

Some of our Year 7 students took part in a trip to Dover Castle today organised by Miss Fraser. Thank you to Miss Fraser, Miss House and Mr Merritt for kindly supporting the trip.

Congratulations to Ms Gradwell who has been appointed Head of English.

We are sadly bidding farewell to Mr Hassan today and wish him all the very best as he moves to pastures new but are delighted to be welcoming four new members of staff to our school community after Easter: Mrs Newington, Teacher of Computer Science and Maths and also Lead Practitioner for Behaviour; Miss Dark, KS3 Lead for Maths; Miss Wright, Teacher of Music and Head of Year; and Mrs Edwards, Teacher of English.

As you will be aware, the school breaks up for the Easter holidays at the end of today. Students are expected to return punctually to school on Monday, 15 April by 8.30 am in readiness for their Form Tutor time and in full school uniform.

Finally, on behalf of the whole staff team, I would like to wish you all a very happy Easter.

End of Term

Gentle reminder that all students are expected to be in school on time at 8.30 am ready for the start of their Form Tutor period.

School Uniform

We would like to stress to you all the importance of presentation, and remind you of our rules regarding our uniform; the school's uniform guidance has been emailed to you all this week. In particular, I would like to draw your attention to the following:

- Hoodies are not allowed. The weather is growing warmer and hopefully they will no longer have a need for extra layers. Hoodies will be confiscated if worn, and can be collected that afternoon, after school;
- Polishable school shoes must be worn;
- Students can have one small earring in each ear and a wristwatch;
- False eyelashes and eyelash extensions are not allowed under any circumstances;
- Acrylic nails are not allowed under any circumstances;
- Facial piercings are not allowed under any circumstances. Clear studs are not acceptable.

If your child arrives to school and is not following the uniform guidance, in particular, the last three items stated in the list above then you should expect a telephone call from the school requesting that you collect your child and make the necessary arrangements to remove these items which are not part of the uniform expectations.

We are proud of the students at Southchurch High School and cannot wait to see them looking smart and ready to learn when we return in April.






