Thank you to Miss Waite who very kindly organised an inspiring and educational experience for our students on Monday; an athlete from Sports for Champions visited the school to speak to our Year 7 students about their career and the training that they have undertaken to this point in their sporting career; offering a unique insight into the world of professional sport. Students were then divided into groups for workshops, culminating in a question-and-answer session.

As we strive to improve the quality of communication between the school and parents/carers, we would like to announce that from the start of the spring term 2026, the My Child at School app (MCAS) will become our primary method of communicating with you regarding school matters.

For those parents/carers who are not familiar with this app it will not only enable you to view various real-time information about your child at school but will also enable us to send out alerts and messages which will ensure you receive all communications from us.

The MCAS app is available for both IOS and Android devices and through the internet on a laptop or other device. MCAS will enable us to contact you quickly instead of using our current text/email system. Please note that MCAS has a translation function which will allow you to receive all information and communication in your chosen language.


A great start to Tuesday for our Year 11 students!

The second half was tense and cagey, with both sides battling for control, but Southchurch edged the play and showed greater determination. With five minutes remaining, Maxwell broke the deadlock, slipping the ball through the keeper's legs to give Southchurch a 3–2 lead.

However, late drama struck when Southchurch conceded a penalty in the dying seconds. Chase High converted with the final kick of the match, making it 3–3 and sending the tie to a penalty shootout.

In the shootout, Southchurch were superb. Jake, the Southchurch goalkeeper, made a crucial save—diving brilliantly to deny one of the Chase High takers—giving his team the advantage and playing a vital role in the victory.

From there, Southchurch's takers were flawless: Herbie, Jayden, Maxwell, Emmanuel, and Logan all struck their penalties with confidence and precision, sealing a 5–4 shootout win and sending Southchurch into the next round of the SOS Cup.
